- More than 500 junior golfers attend our junior camps each year.
- Golf Carts are equipped with GPS, which includes stereo, yardage, layout, food and beverage ordering capabilities and 2 way communication.
- We are open to the public, but do offer golf memberships and range memberships.
- We offer multiple clinics that include women, men, beginner, junior and our PGA HOPE Veterans Program.
- We provide a web-based tee time service that allows customers to easily book their tee times online.



LaFortune Park Tennis

The world class facility and staff at LaFortune Park Tennis Center brought home the gold with the League of Exceptional Players, who participated in the Special Olympics qualifier, and Team Willis 55+ 6.0 women's team that captured the National title in Orlando in late October 2023.

Did you know?

- More than 100,000 people play at LaFortune each year including 1000 junior players.
- More than 250 USTA teams originate from LaFortune annually with 1960 unique players.
- 15 certified teaching pros teach, coach, and mentor.
- There are no membership fees; just pay as you play.
- Twelve courts are marked for kids 10 and under.
- LaFortune is the only organized public tennis facility in Tulsa and is open 360 days a year.
- More than \$10 million in private funds have been raised to support past and future tennis projects.
- LaFortune was host to one of the largest pickleball tournaments in the state.
- LaFortune Park Tennis was named the USTA Featured Facility of the Year in 2018.
- LaFortune Park Tennis has been selected as a premier facility two years in a row (2023 and 2024) by the USTA because of its impressive programs recognized nationwide.

The Great Easter Egg Hunt

Chandler Park is set to host the County's largest Easter egg hunt on Saturday, March 23rd, from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Boasting **30,000 eggs** for children up to 12-years-old, alongside food trucks, a petting zoo, children's music, and STEAM activities. The event is free, but <u>registration is required here.</u>



Guess What Reopened?

Chandler Park has reopened its Lower Level after being closed for 15 years. This newly accessible area boasts a walking trail with interpretive signs that shares the park's rich history. To ensure accessibility for all, the trail will be



upgraded to meet ADA standards with paving and lighting.

Clients are required to secure employment, save for housing, and demonstrate progress towards their objectives, with a goal of transitioning into housing within 90 days.

Our housing specialists, and individual and family support specialists, work with our clients to achieve their goals and hold them accountable.
